bay	Part of the coast where the land curves in and is surrounded by the sea on three sides.
Beaches	A strip of land that borders an ocean, river or lake.
Rock pools	Small pools of seawater that form along the coastline. These sometimes are habitats to many sea creatures.
Harbour	A place on the coast, where water meets land, which is sheltered by natural or man-made walls. Harbours have deep water which help to make sure that large ships don't touch the bottom and get stuck.

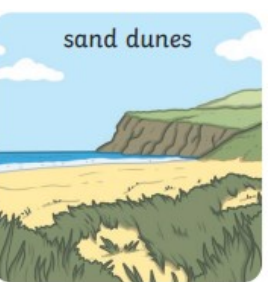
Physical features of a seaside

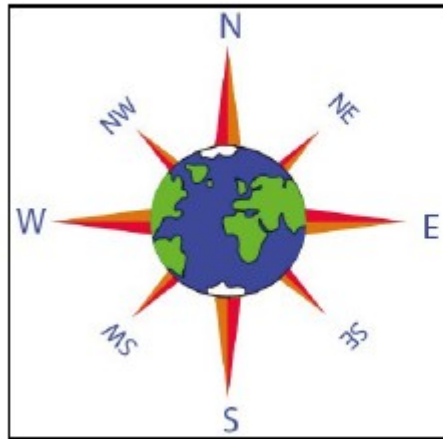
A seaside **resort** has many **physical features**. **Features** such as the beach, the sea, cliffs and caves have been made naturally. This means they were made by nature.
